*You might be a new Rotarian, or you might have been there in that same seat year after year for what seems like a lifetime! Who are you? Does every other member know who you are? It’s time to update your Rotary resume.*

*If you want to have fun on a day without a program (or your speaker doesn’t show, God forbid!) try having updated classification talks – or call them resume talks. Older members might know everyone in the club, including their favorite flavor of ice cream, but the newer members might not have had that opportunity to know the backgrounds of your other members.*

*Many clubs have interesting ways to call upon members for repeat classification – or resume talks. One club has everyone’s name assigned to a playing card and written on a list. When time permits for a resume talk, a card is drawn from the deck and that person has to speak. When finished, they have the option of having their card torn up or returned to the deck. It’s lots of fun – and often reveals unknown facts about one’s past.*

*Or take the pressure off those who are anxious about speaking in front of others – make up a list of questions for them to answer. Such as what was their first job, where did they go to school, what sports teams did they play on, etc.*

If you add or terminate a member to your club, do it immediately on DaCdb, and continuously update email addresses for your members.

**DaCdb: Checking SPAM / JUNK Mail Folders:**

For whatever reason some emails end up in your SPAM or Junk Mail Folders. These can be from an individual, from DaCdb, or from a server sending out newsletters you have subscribed to at some time in the past.

- This can be due to filters established by your ISPs. The ISP initially holds the message in your SPAM / Junk Folder until you allow the message through.
- Some ISPs will automatically empty the SPAM folder after 72 hours...and after that you will never know if a message was received and missed.
- If you do not regularly check your SPAM folder you really should as many times valid emails are routed to SPAM. No rhyme or reason why this happens to some messages...but it does.
- You can set a SPAM filter to allow messages with the word **Rotary** in the **Subject Line** to be allowed through...this is called the "Whitelist" You can talk with your ISP to find out how to whitelist if it is not included in their Help Files.
